

**NJ Lighthouse Society, Inc.
Minutes of September 28, 1996
Twin Lights**

President Tom Laverty opened meeting at 11:25 a.m.

Steve Martorano moved that the minutes from the June meeting in Havre de Grace, MD, be approved. Motion carried.

Debby Megonigal gave the treasurer's report. There is a balance of \$4,737.99; the savings account balance is \$4,220.86. Motion made and carried to approve the report.

Tom gave the President's report. He received correspondence from Mark Lewis, England, who wishes to correspond with people; Tom will ask Kim Ruth to put this in the Beam.

Yvonne Miller, Programs, gave a report. The next meeting is December 7 in Tuckerton. The March meeting will possibly be in Barnegat Light; program to be decided. Ideas for future are Liberty State Park in NJ, and Delaware.

Joan Walton reported there are approximately 600 members, including families. Joan gave the Correspondence Secretary's report. We sent \$150 to Friends of Concord Point Light. The raffle for Saugerties Light stay sold over \$1,600 of tickets. Joan stated Ray Fisk will screen any slides that people want to send to him for use in the New Jersey Lighthouse Calendar.

In the absence of Carole DiNapoli, Tom Laverty gave the activities report. There are still seats available on the October 19 boat trip from Kingston, NY.

Bill Gately, Ways and Means, reported our Society had tables at three festivals. We sold about \$593 of merchandise at the Clearwater and Heritage Festivals, and about \$269 at Fort Mott. Net profit was about 40 percent of those amounts. Bill stated they need members for the ways and means committee.

Rich Veit, Publicity, stated he has tried to contact the Lighthouse Digest; he is trying to meet with Tim Harrison on November 15. On July 26 he and Elinor met with IPPA, Atlantic City.

Tom Laverty reported we are the official tour guides for Sandy Hook Light. Beginning October 27, our Society is running tours. He passed around a sign-up sheet for future tour guides.

Yvonne Miller reported that Mrs. Miah Maull, a school teacher, had her class make items out of lighthouse photos. The students then visited lighthouses over the summer.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:08 p.m.
